Three front-line workers from London will feature on separate covers for its July issue of British Vogue. Train Driver Narguis Horsford, midwife Rachel Millar and supermarket assistant Anisa Omar were captured by Photographer Jamie Hawkesworth for a 20 page feature in the fashion magazine.

Vogue's editor-in-chief Edward Enninful said. "They represent the millions of people in the UK who, at the height of the pandemic, put on their uniforms and went to help. This moment in history required something extra special, a moment of thanks to the new front line."

Anisa Omar says that "You're putting yourself at risk by being at work, but it's worth it because you're helping people... If I can put a smile on someone's face because i', smiling, that's amazing for me. That's all I need."

Jamie Hawkesworth is a British Fashion and Documentary photographer. In 2010 he worked on a project called, *Preston is my Paris*, Documenting the coming and goings of people in Prestons bus station.

After hearing the station was set to be demolished he spent every day of a month photographing the characters of the landmark.

His work is grounded, playful and subtle and captures the true essence of people and place.






