Job description

- ✓ To attend STEM training meetings to help prepare for the STEM Enrichment club activities.
- ✓ To support the STEM clubs by engaging with the young learners and helping them with their work.
- ✓ To meet with other Ambassadors termly to plan STEM events (such as Workshops or Women in STEM events)
- ✓ To plan and deliver a specific event where STEM is the Theme.
- ✓ To Promote STEM by attending workshops and other trips and sharing experiences with other students.

- To have excellent communication skills, both face-to-face and by email
- To have a very positive attitude to STEM subjects and careers
- To be interested in supporting younger pupils in the STEM clubs
- To have the ability to explain the importance of STEM careers to the future of many young people today
- To be a positive role model in terms of punctuality, organisation, reliability and behaviour
